Lyon Downriver Services is a full service Marine Repair Contractor bringing all of the topside resources of a full service shipyard directly to the customer's vessel. We go to them! We offer a quick response management team which supports a large technical workforce without the costly expense of a full service shipyard. Many of these contracts are quick turnaround, bid on Monday, awarded on Tuesday morning with work starting Tuesday afternoon. The work is similar to what we perform in the main yard but at an accelerated pace and at a location that could be at the Amphibious Base Little Creek, Virginia Beach, VA, Guam, or the Philippines.

# **BELZONA TRAINING**

In January 2017, Lyon Shipyard employees from the Sheet Metal , Inside Paint and Outside Machine Shops, received class room instruction as well as hands on training on Belzona. This training session was compled by Allan Montgomery of Industrial Maintenance Solutions Inc. During these training sessions, employees received training on the benefits of Belzona, the different types, usages of, as well as, the safest and correct way to mix and apply the product.

Belzona has a long history of being used in the yard. Some of the usages are as a coating to preserve and lengthen the life span of pumps or a cost effective compound for making repairs to steel, where otherwise, welding may not be a feasible, cost effective nor practical alternative.

## SAFETY

As the Safety Department focuses on the closing of 2016 and what lies ahead in 2017, there are a few major improvements on the horizon. One major enhancement for 2017 is the kick off of the Lyon Shipyard Safety Committee. This will be a great opportunity for representatives from all the shops to play a key role in making sound safety decisions. The decisions made by the committee will improve our working environment and have a direct impact on our workers overall wellbeing. The second change will be the introduction of a safety representative on night shift. By having safety support the night shift crew, we hope to further reduce injuries and ensure everyone goes home safely. The final improvement entails research and possible replacement

of targeted Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to help reduce injuries in the yard. As a company, our goal has always been "ZERO" accidents or injuries. We will continue to strive to reach that goal. But we can't do it alone. We need everyone's help towards achieving that goal.

For 2017, we would like to challenge every shop and department on the yard. Let's see if we can reduce our injuries by 20% and correct all safety issues we see immediately. Whether it is a deck plate worker or management, we all can make a difference, so let's make it happen!





# **QUALITY ASSURANCE**

If anything, we plan on speeding up! In an effort to be ABS and NAVSEA compliant across the board when it comes to weld and NDT qualifications, already approved procedures may need to be revised, tweaked, or resubmitted in their entirety. Our goals are to tighten up existing items as well as obtain qualifications we do not currently have such as Magnetic Particle (MT) Testing, and 6000 series Aluminum welding.

When teaching our QA Indoc class, as the QA Manager, I sometimes say to the group, "Please define quality." Once, someone said, "I might not know the definition, but I know it when I see it." Fair enough, nothing says you have to be the subject matter expert to know something



is wrong. If something just does not seem right to you, grab someone from the QA Department and let's work it out together.

In addition, some of the positive comments from the management team are reflected below:



- 4 teaspoons extra-virgin olive oil,
- 4 pieces bacon, chopped
- 1 8-ounce package of button mushrooms, (halved if large)
- 2 cups chopped onion
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 cup reduced-sodium chicken broth
- 3 cups of your favorite veggies

Serve over rice (optional)

Toss all the ingredients in your slow cooker, make sure to add the bacon and chicken first. Turn on the slow cooker when you leave the house and after your shift you will have a healthy, home cooked meal.
